Past City Run Events

- **Skypark Playground Ribbon Cutting-** Jan 31- Hundreds of people showed up to support the official reopening of the Skypark Big Kid Playground. During the ceremony, the City Manager, City Council and Park and Rec commissioners received a recognition from the offices of Gail Pellerin and John Laird on the re opening of the playground. The afternoon was filled with excitement. Big thanks to Togo's for donating sandwiches and Food Truck A Go Go for helping make the event a success!
- **Family Glow in the Dark Dance Night-** Feb 6th- We had over 50 dancers decked out in glow sticks attend our Family Dance Night and learn fun dance routines choregraphed by a local dance instructor.

Upcoming City Run Events

- **Expressions of the Valley: Art and Poetry Contest-** All ages in SV and SLV are encouraged to submit their Art and/or Poetry submission, by April 1, that reflects the theme: Belong. The Art and Poetry Showcase will be on May 14th at the Community Center.
- **Puzzle Night-** March 22 6-8pm- Teams compete to be the fastest team to complete their puzzle.

Recreation

- The Winter/Spring recreation guide is live and available online through our website. Hard copies can be found at the Recreation office, City Hall and various places around town.
- The new recreation software is live. Emails have been sent to all residents who had accounts on our previous software encouraging them to create new accounts on the new software. Reservations and registration are being accepted, and the system is functioning well.

Projects

- **Skypark Big Kid Playground-** Staff are working with Ross Recreation to expand the pour in place surface around the accessible swings.
- **Skypark Master Plan RFP-** Staff reviewed seven RFP proposals and selected three firms to interview. Interviews have been completed and staff will be bringing a contract to City Council for approval.
- **Al Shugart Dog Park-**The project is moving forward with meeting CEQA compliance. = Environmental surveys are currently being conducted regarding the Ohlone Beetle and potential habitat for special-status plant species. These surveys will take place in February & April for the Ohlone Tiger Beetle and in and July/Aug for the special plant species.

Leagues

- **Soccer League-** A five-year MOU between the Soccer Club and the City will be brought to City Council for approval. This MOU has an increase yearly fee to bring the leagues use into alignment with the cost recovery goals.
- **Softball League-** Staff have met with representatives from softball discussing the leagues use of the snack shack to sell concessions during their season. The city and league will enter into an agreement for exclusive use during their season for 2026.

Parks

- **SkyPark:** Crews were out last week completing concrete repairs to sidewalks to reduce trip hazards around the park
- **Siltanen:** All fields received a top dressing to address the unlevelled conditions. The retaining wall beneath pre school was replaced.
- **Tennis:** Staff met with the contractor who did the court resurfacing to talk about the recent cracks that have appeared. Repairs will be scheduled when the courts are able to dry out.
- **Siltanen Pool:** Update from Jeff Griffith-Jones from Pacific Flow Swim School. Below is a chart comparing the usage from 2024 to 2025
